HOLY WEEK NOTICES



COLLECTION IN SUPPORT OF THE HOLY PLACES IN THE MIDDLE EAST: In accordance with Archdiocesan tradition, this collection will be taken up at the Solemn Liturgical Action on Good Friday, **April 18th**. Last year our community contributed over \$1150 to this very worthy cause.



CONFESSIONS DURING HOLY WEEK: There will be plenty of opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Penance during Holy Week. Please note the extended confession times on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday in the timetable. **The Confession times are strict, so please allow yourself plenty of time and be mindful of other people while making your confession.**



CHRISM MASS: The annual Chrism Mass is scheduled at 7.00pm on Tuesday, **April 15th** at St. Mary's Cathedral. During this Mass, the Holy Oils will be blessed and the Chrism will be consecrated. The Oils and Chrism from this Mass are used in Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation throughout the Archdiocese of Perth. Everyone is welcome to attend this Mass.



COMPLINE AT ST. ANNE'S: Compline is the final, or evening, prayers from the Canonical Hours. Using the *Roman Breviary*, Compline consists of introductory prayers, psalms, hymns, the Canticle of Simeon (*Nunc Dimittes*), and benediction. Compline will take place on Tuesday, **April 15th** after Low Mass.

MOVIE SCREENING: The ending of "Jesus of Nazareth" will be screened in the Hall after the Solemn Liturgical Action on Good Friday, **April 18th**. Light refreshments will also be available on this day.



TENEBRAE: There will be a Tenebrae service at St. Anne's on **Good Friday** starting at 7.30pm. The service is a special form of Matins and Lauds where the purpose is to recreate the emotional aspects of the Lord's Passion and Death. The service begins with the church being solely lit by 15 candles and ends with darkness and the strepitus (loud noise).

HOLY SATURDAY: The Hall will be open after the Holy Saturday Vigil Mass with burgers and beverages available for purchase. The food and service will be supplied by the St. Anne's branch of the Knights of the Southern Cross.

SANCTA MARTA VOLUNTEERS WANTED: Sancta Marta relies on the generosity of our volunteers to run the kitchen each Sunday morning to provide delicious food and drinks to St. Anne's community members. Volunteers are needed in the Hall, particularly after the 9.30am and 11.30am Masses, to help with taking orders, cooking and serving food, making coffees, and washing dishes. ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The liturgical chant of Holy Week is particularly distinctive and rich. On **Palm Sunday**, the cantors will sing the elaborate and ancient verses of the Offertorium (Improperium expectavit). Although St Thomas Aquinas's Pange Lingua Gloriosi is well known and its last two verses are sung at Benediction routinely, it is far less well known that Pange Lingua of Good Friday served as the model for his much-loved text for the Office of Corpus Christi. The musical contrasts throughout the Triduum are especially striking. From the Gloria of Maundy

Thursday to the Gloria of Easter Saturday, the organ is entirely silent (that is, it cannot be used even to support the singing). On Easter Sunday, one of the few sequences to have survived the Tridentine reforms, the **Victimae Paschali Laudes**, is sung.

The Mass setting on Palm Sunday remains **Mass XVII** with **Credo III** and the Marian Antiphon is the **Ave Regina Caelorum**. On **Maundy Thursday**, the Mass setting changes to **Mass IV**. At the Easter **Vigil** and then through the rest of Paschaltide, **Mass I** is sung with **Credo III**. The Marian Antiphon then also becomes the **Regina Caeli**. Le Tisserand's 14th -century O Filii et Filiae will be sung at the Offertory of the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday; all are invited to join in the singing of the Alleluias as marked on the sheet.


MUSIC BOOKLETS FOR SUNDAY SUNG MASS: Please continue to make use of the booklets provided especially for the congregation's use. These are different to the editions used by church choirs because they are marked up, showing clearly what sections should be sung by the congregation in bold. The singing of the Ordinary of the Mass, as per the consistent instruction of the popes since at least the time of St Pius X, when sung in plainchant, belongs to the entire congregation and not to the choir alone. It is hoped that in time, the congregation at St Anne's will take up the singing of the Mass Ordinaries with the same fervor as its annual singing of Christmas Carols, so that it can be heard singing the texts of the liturgy itself strongly through the entire liturgical year..

"It is the duty of all those to whom Christ the Lord has entrusted the task of guarding and dispensing the Church's riches *to preserve this precious treasure of Gregorian chant diligently and to impart it generously to the Christian people*. [...] May it thus come about that the Christian people begin even on this earth to sing that song of praise it will sing forever in heaven." (*Musicae Sacrae*, Pius XII, 1955)
